BILLS INTRODUCED:

A10108 Allows the governor to review decisions by the parole board to grant or deny release on parole to inmates serving a sentence of imprisonment, or the imposition of conditions of such release.

A10115 Provides court appointed special advocates access to certain records associated with child abuse and neglect cases.

A10126 Relates to school property tax reduction for persons 65 years of age or over; relates to funding of certain mandated programs for municipal corporations; makes technical corrections to a chapter of the laws of 2007.

A10127 Relates to school property tax reduction; establishes a blue ribbon commission on real property tax reform; relates to state assistance for local real property tax reassessment; provides state assistance to assessing units within a single school district which revalue during the same year; provides for a fixed real property assessed value for residential real property owned by persons 65 years of age or older and provides state reimbursement to municipalities for lost real property tax revenue; requires the state to fund certain programs mandated for municipal corporations and school districts.

A10145 Increases amount of available aid to public libraries for family literacy grants from \$300,000 to \$1,200,000.

A10151 Relates to confidentiality of information contained in pistol license applications.

A10189 Allows the detention of a respondent of a "sex offender requiring civil management petition" pending trial; establishes the standard of proof at trial be "beyond a reasonable doubt" rather than "by clear and convincing evidence".

PASSED ASSEMBLY: A09673 Establishes a person is guilty of aggravated harassment in the second degree when, with the intent to harass, annoy, threaten or alarm another person he or she transmits or delivers a written communication, which includes a recording, in a manner likely to cause annoyance or alarm.
